



CHILDREN IN THE WILDERNESS IN A NUTSHELL

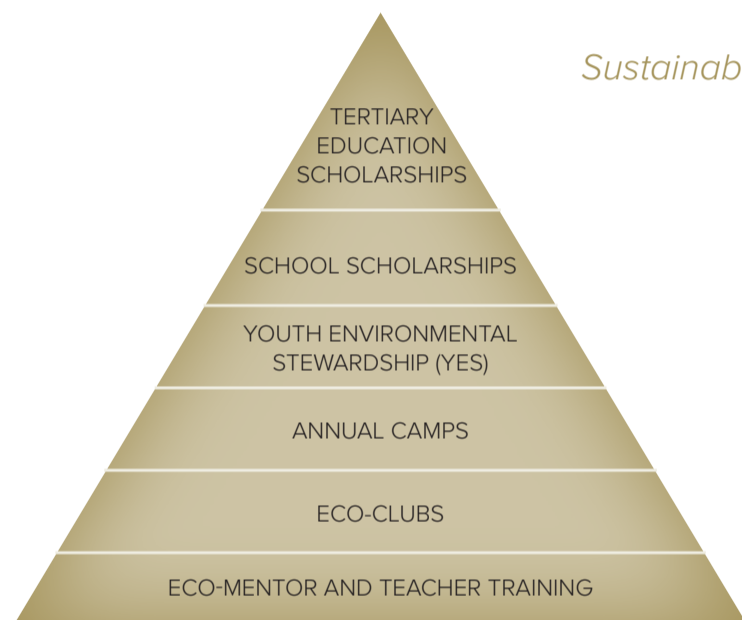
Children in the Wilderness (CITW) is a life skills and environmental educational programme for children who live in the neighbouring villages around the wild areas. The programme is a grassroots initiative of Wilderness Safaris aimed at giving disadvantaged children an opportunity to learn about their environment and their role in saving it.

CITW began in 2001 in Botswana and currently takes place in seven countries: Botswana, Malawi, Namibia, Rwanda, South Africa, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

CITW currently supports over **3 000 children** in Eco-Clubs.

Since CITW is a not-for-profit organisation, it relies on funds donated by the Wilderness Wildlife Trust, generous donors, or fundraising events such as the Nedbank Tour de Tuli mountain bike event.
